Early Recovery Cluster

The Early Recovery Cluster (ERC) at the federal level is led by the Ministry of Federal Affairs and General Administration (MoFAGA); and at the provincial level, it is led by various ministries. The ERC co-lead at the federal and provincial level is UNDP. The key objectives of the ERC includes- Information Management support, support on resumption of livelihoods through cash for work and promotion of income generating opportunities, rehabilitation of essential community infrastructures, and support to government to strengthen DRRM. Following the 27-28 September 2024 floods, the ERC held its meetings on 1st and 23rd October 2024 at the federal level, and the provincial level cluster meetings were held in Koshi (27th November 2024) and Bagmati (5th December 2024) led by MoIAL and in Madesh (19th December 2024) province led by MoHCL .

Information Management Support

- Eight Information Management Officers (IMO) have been seconded by UNDP, 1 in NDRRMA since 21 Oct 2024, and 7 in DDMCs of DAO in Kavre, Dhading, Makwanpur, Rautahat, Saptari, Okhaldunga and Panchthar districts to support district-level coordination and information management.
- Human resources have been deployed in 37 local governments across 17 disaster-affected districts by various organizations, including Care Nepal, IOM, NHRSP, NRCS, NSET, PIN, Plan International, Save the Children, UNDP, UNICEF and WVI to support shelter data collection from communities to assist them in accessing government financial assistance for temporary shelters.

Governance Support

- Care Nepal, NRCS, Save the Children, Shanti Jana Adharsha Sewa Kendra, UNDP and UNICEF have supported DAO Kavre in organizing a two-day workshop on 'Lessons Learnt from the Kavre Disaster,' held on 18–19 December 2024.
- Catholic Relief Services (CRS) conducted a Geo-Hazard Risk Assessment in six sites within Panauti municipality and Roshi rural municipality of Kavre District.
- UNDP has supported and further strengthened Kavre District's Emergency Operations Center (DEOC) by providing essential information management and communication equipment.
- A study on impact of floods and landslide on vulnerable groups is being undertaken by UNDP for a deeper analysis of issues and challenges, which can provide guidance on inclusive recovery.



Community Engagement in Cash for Work, Panauti, Kavre, CRS

Livelihoods/Cash for Work

- UNDP has supported 130 HHs of Roshi municipality of Kavre district through 7 days cash for work intervention to rehabilitate community infrastructures. A cash-for-work intervention is ongoing in Kavre and Lalitpur districts which will benefit 730 HHs.
- ADRA Nepal provided cash support to 70 HHs in Balara municipality, Sarlahi, and 45 HHs in Durga Bhagwati rural municipality, Rautahat, targeting households with pregnant women.
- UNICEF has supported 830 HHs in Namobuddha municipality and 269 households in Bethanchowk municipality in Kavre district through Multi-Purpose Cash Transfer (MPC).
- Action Aid Nepal has supported 350 HHs in the Konjyosom municipality of Lalitpur district through a Cash-for-Work program for debris clearance and 200 HHs with livelihood restoration kits.
- Catholic Relief Services (CRS) has reached 450 HHs in Roshi rural municipality and 150 HHs of Panauti municipality of Kavre district through cash for work modality for restoration of critical community infrastructures.
- The restoration of multilayer agroforestry plantations is ongoing at two sites in Sarlahi and Jhapa districts through UNDP, aiming to enhance the livelihoods of flood-affected communities.
- United Nations Central Emergency Response Fund (CERF) Anticipatory Action programme, is has supported 908 HHs in Mandandeupur municipality, 552 HHs in Mahankal municipality and 278 HHs in Konjyosom municipality through Multi-Purpose Cash Transfer (MPC).



Debris Clearance Through Cash for Work, Roshi RM, Kavre, UNDP

Debris Clearance

- ActionAid Nepal has provided material support to 100 households in Kathmandu for debris clearance.
- Debris clearance works is ongoing at 3 sites in Konjyosom rural municipality of Lalitpur and 2 sites in Roshi rural Municipalities of Kavre with the support from UNDP to restore agricultural land and roads, supporting community recovery.
